## Single Phase Service

### Residential Service

#### **AVAILABILITY**

Service under this schedule is available at points on the Cooperative's interconnected system where existing facilities of adequate capacity and desired phase and voltage are available, and additional investment by the Cooperative for new transmission, substation, or terminal facilities is not necessary to supply the desired service.

#### **APPLICABILITY**

Service under this schedule is applicable to electric service required for residential service members and general domestic uses, including single phase motors, of 10 horsepower rating or less, subject to the following conditions:

- 1) When usage at a dwelling is used predominately for business, professional or other gainful purposes, the premises will be classified as a non-residential and the appropriate schedules applied. However, if the wiring is so arranged that the service for residential purposes can be metered separately, this schedule will be applied to such service.
- 2) Whenever the member's equipment does not conform to the cooperative's specifications, service will be supplied under the appropriate schedule.
- 3) This schedule is not applicable to standby service, service for resale, or shared service.

#### **TYPE OF SERVICE**

The type of service provided under this schedule is single phase, at the standard voltage available for the premises to be served, supplied through one meter at one point of delivery.

#### **MONTHLY CHARGE**

The Monthly Charge is the sum of the Fixed Charge and kWh charge at the following rates:

**MINIMUM CHARGE**

The monthly minimum charge shall be the Fixed Charge. Should a member's service be physically disconnected for a continuous 12-month period, the Cooperative reserves the right to physically retire the service anytime thereafter.

Members may elect to enroll in the Levelized Payment Plan. This Plan allows members to make equal monthly payments on their electric bills as specified in Policy 60.

A special handling fee will be charged should the member request or require a kWh usage adjustment.

**TIME OF PAYMENT**

All meters are to be read by the member by the 5<sup>th</sup> of each month and payments are due at the remittance address on or before the 5<sup>th</sup> of each month. If the 5<sup>th</sup> falls on a Saturday, Sunday or legal holiday, the account shall be paid on or before the next regular business day.
